1 Opening Remarks

Don Cooper called the meeting to order at 14:03, welcoming everyone to the meeting, thanking them for their attendance. He acknowledged the online participants, expressing his condolences that they could not attend in person on such a beautiful day in Anaheim.

2 Patent and anti-trust statements

2.1 Reading of the anti-trust statement

Don Cooper read the following statement aloud to the assembly:

ESTA and its members take seriously their obligation to comply with all applicable antitrust laws. Therefore, during this meeting and during all ESTA events, all discussions will be limited to those subjects that are

permitted by the antitrust laws. All members should refrain from any discussion or mention of competitively sensitive subjects such as the current or future prices charged for any member product or services, current or future marketing plans or strategies, and current or future costs, including employee salaries. There also must be no agreement on the suppliers or customers that members will or will not do business with or the markets in which members will conduct business.

Violations of the antitrust laws can have serious consequences. If you have any questions or concerns about anything that is discussed at an ESTA meeting, please bring your concern to ESTA management. An easy to read pamphlet describing the antitrust laws is available from the ESTA staff.

Karl Ruling displayed the pamphlet for all to see.

2.2 Reading of the call for patents

Don Cooper read the following statement aloud to the assembly:

ESTA intends not to publish any standard that contains protected intellectual property, unless that information can be licensed by anyone for a reasonable fee. ESTA uses a process of open patent and copyright disclosures to implement its intent. ESTA does not conduct patent or copyright searches and does not warrant that its standards contain no protected intellectual property.

In keeping with the open disclosures policy, I ask if anyone present wishes to notify this working group of the existence of a patent, patent application, copyright, or other protected intellectual property that might protect material in a standard being developed by this working group. You need not be the holder of the patent or copyright to notify this working group of its existence.

Nothing was revealed.

Membership is open to all parties who are affected by the work of the group; membership in ESTA is not a requirement, but there is a \$100/person/year participation fee to help fund the costs of running the Technical Standards Program. This action will be taken at the beginning of the first meeting after such inaction and will be recorded in the minutes of that meeting.

Any news, updates, or action?

Chris Schmidt reported that they have made significant progress, and are nearly complete. He asked if there were existing standards for scenic elements that are attached to rigging systems. Discussion revealed that there are not, but also suggested that risk assessments might be one way to address it. Randall Greenlee said that they are developing standards in Europe for "Motion and Lifting Operations", which address movement of people and scenery on stages.

Chris asked if it would be acceptable or appropriate to send their draft to the RWG prior to consideration for public review. Yes!

He also brought up task group questions about break and rest periods, and if there were known standards other than OSHA guidelines for water and shade, etc. Dominic Housiaux said that there are specific EU requirements for this, e.g. it is illegal to work more than 48 hours in a week. This led to discussion about existing standards for industrial hygiene, and similar. Dominic suggested that there is a good opportunity for coordinating with the Medical task group's document.

Steve Serafin mentioned that there is a very rudimentary framework in E1.60, addressing ergonomics, work time limits, etc. that might be useful.

There was discussion about whether the changes applied to indoor use.

Don Cooper reiterated the importance of provide the source of defined terms.

7 New business

7.1 Barricades or barriers

Richard Nix said that barricades – or barriers, if that term is synonymous – are important, but they are not included in the structures document, because of the many different types and functions of devices that could be used to prevent access, direct pedestrian or vehicular traffic flow, or to demarcate boundaries. Some of them have no structural requirements, while others might have structural requirements. Should they be covered in the crowd management standard, or would they merit having their own standard?

Dominic Housiaux asked if we were talking about the use of barricades, or the strength of barricades.

Steve Adelman commented that he liked the distinction between barriers and barricades. He also said that he thought this was a topic that merited discussion, and asked that people who were in the business of barricades or barriers to at least review any work that might be done in the future.

The consensus was to call these things “barriers” rather than “barricades,” since barricades implies a particular kind of barrier, and a range of barriers are useful for different applications. The chapter in the Event Safety Guide is entitled “Barriers.”

Don Cooper asked the task group leaders to provide a short summary of how barriers or barricades might be used or otherwise referenced in their respective standards.

7.2 Ballast

Ethan Gilson reported on an incident that occurred recently in Boston, during which an employee of an entertainment company was killed by an overturning ballast. He asked if the topic of ballast and ballast management might be a candidate for consideration as a new standard. He said there are currently no standards for ballast, but he also said that this might also be considered a material handling issue, outside of the scope of our work.

Dominic said that he thought, historically, the industry at large has done a very poor job of addressing material handling.

Danielle Hernandez said she thought material handling in the entertainment industry was an excellent candidate for consideration. Chris Schmidt said that there are a number of material handling requirements in OSHA, Baer concurred, saying that the OSHA 10 and OSHA 30 training that his company requires for all employees does address aspects of material handling.

There were other examples given. Randall Greenlee said that they rely on the risk assessment to help determine the specific material handling requirements, in Europe.

After even more discussion Don Cooper suggested that the primary question is “what do we do about it?” Robert Haycock suggested that this is a topic for consideration in other standards. Dominic asked that this remain on the agenda as a topic for the next meeting. Don Cooper made it so, asking everyone to give it further consideration.

8 Other business and announcements

8.1 Above & Beyond Awards

Reason: Chris Schmidt has stepped up and kept the Event safety rigging task Group on track through many adverse conditions. It has been a complicated subject trying to properly describe a numerous technical tasks to the wide variety of possible Event safety Standard readers. The subject is elusive to many promoters and event planners and it has been the task of the group to find the precise wording and arrangement of subjects in order to assure the reader's comprehension of this most important subject. Many, many hours have been spent dissecting each subject and Chris has personally spent many hours in addition to the weekly webex meeting (which he managed) writing suggested copy and researching numerous other reference documents. The standard is getting close to being submitted to the working group and for public comment. I would have waited to make this nomination at that point, but I understand the deadline is approaching and I thought his contributions to be significant enough to warrant consideration even before the project is completely finished.

Don Earl presented the award to Chris, and pictures were taken of the presentation, while everyone gave Chris

a large round of applause and congratulations.
