1 Opening Remarks

In the absence of the working group chairpersons at the meeting start time, Mike Wood volunteered to run the meeting, and called the meeting to order at 17:07. Welcoming everyone to the meeting. (Dittmer and Schoeneman joined the meeting later.)

2 Patent and anti-trust statements

2.1 Reading of the anti-trust statement

The following statement was read aloud to the assembly by Mike Wood:

ESTA and its members take seriously their obligation to comply with all applicable antitrust laws. Therefore, during this meeting and during all ESTA events, all discussions will be limited to those subjects that are permitted by the antitrust laws. All members should refrain from any discussion or mention of competitively sensitive subjects such as the current or future prices charged for any member product or services, current or future marketing plans or strategies, and current or future costs, including employee salaries. There also must be no agreement on the suppliers or customers that members will or will not do business with or the markets in which members will conduct business.

Violations of the antitrust laws can have serious consequences. If you have any questions or concerns about anything that is discussed at an ESTA meeting, please bring your concern to ESTA management. An easy to read pamphlet describing the antitrust laws is available from the ESTA staff.

Karl Ruling held a copy in front of the camera. No concerns were raised.

2.2 Reading of the call for patents

The following statement was read aloud to the assembly by Mike Wood:

ESTA intends not to publish any standard that contains protected intellectual property, unless that information can be licensed by anyone for a reasonable fee. ESTA uses a process of open patent and copyright disclosures to implement its intent. ESTA does not conduct patent or copyright searches and does not warrant that its standards contain no protected intellectual property.

In keeping with the open disclosures policy, I ask if anyone present wishes to notify this working group of the existence of a patent, patent application, copyright, or other protected intellectual property that might protect material in a standard being developed by this working group. You need not be the holder of the patent or

copyright to notify this working group of its existence.

Nothing was revealed.

3 Attendance and Membership

3.1 Requirements for membership

The following statement was read aloud to the assembly by Mike Wood:

Membership is open to all parties who are affected by the work of the group; membership in ESTA is not a requirement, but there is a \$100/person/year participation fee to help fund the costs of running the Technical Standards Program. Voting members are required to attend meetings and vote on letter ballots. Any principal member and alternate that both miss three consecutive meetings or that miss three consecutive letter ballots will have their membership status changed to observer. This action will be taken at the beginning of the first meeting after such inaction and will be recorded in the minutes of that meeting.

6.1 ANSI E1.5 – 2009 (R2018), Entertainment Technology - Theatrical Fog Made with Aqueous Solutions of Di- and Trihydric Alcohols (Reaffirmation, revision, or withdrawal by 29 November 2023) No action. There was a brief discussion of PM2.5 and PM10 and the inexpensive devices now available for measuring particle size.

6.2 ANSI E1.14 - 2018, Entertainment Technology—Recommendations for Inclusions in Fog Equipment Manuals (Revise, reaffirm, or withdraw by 27 February, 2023). No news or action.

6.3 ANSI E1.23 - 2020, Entertainment Technology - Design and Execution of Theatrical Fog Effects (Revise, reaffirm, or withdraw by 2025) No news or action.

6.4 ANSI E1.29 – 2009 (R2018), Product Safety Standard for Theatrical Fog Generators that Create Aerosols of Water, Aqueous Solutions of Glycol or Glycerin, or Aerosols of Highly Refined Alkane Mineral Oil (*Reaffirmation, revision, or withdrawal by 06 November 2023*) No news or action.

6.5 ANSI E1.40 – 2016, Recommendations For the Planning of Theatrical Dust Effects (*Reaffirmation*, revision, or withdrawal by 16 September 2021)

Mike Wood asked if it was time to consider action on this document. He suggested surveying the list of available studies and papers to see if there might be impact on this document's recommendations. There was no motion made.

6.6 Introduction to Modern Atmospheric Effects, 6th edition

No decision was made about adding information about PM_{2.5} and PM₁₀.

Hans Lau reported that the latest version of fog and haze guidelines for the film industry (Safety Bulletin 10) is dated 28 June 2019, and the recommendations for dust date back to 2005. He typed <u>https://www.csatf.org/safety_bulletin_10/</u> in the chat window for everyone.

Larry Schoeneman asked if the body of medical community had studies to back up their opinions, and would they be willing to share this information. Cedric Jackson said that he thought that the answer was yes to both questions.

Larry Schoeneman said that he did not wish to move forward on a standards action until the science is made available. The consensus agreed. Cedric Jackson said that he would ask for the information. There was more discussion, at the end of which, everyone agreed they will be anxious to see the research data. Larry asked Karl to distribute the information when it was received. Karl Ruling said he would do so.

There was no report. No information had been received, so Karl Ruling had distributed none.

7 New business

Mona Shum asked if there had been any requests for information about COVID and fog. Karl Ruling said that he had read some reports that fog is detrimental to the live virus. He said he had also read reports about fog machines being used for sanitizing purposes.

Hans Lau said he found a paper from 1947 pertaining to US Navy studies testing the use of fog machines for sanitization purposes. He said that he had seen advertisements for class action law suits regarding the use of fog machines for such purposes.

Lau shared <u>https://synexis.com</u>, which is the URL for a company using hydrogen peroxide as a disinfectant.
