1 Opening remarks

Tim Hansen called the meeting to order at 14:06, thanking everyone for their attendance today. There were four present in the room, and seven present online.

2 ESTA declarations

2.1 Reading of the anti-trust statement

Tim Hansen read the following statement aloud to the assembly:

ESTA and its members take seriously their obligation to comply with all applicable antitrust laws. Therefore, during this meeting and during all ESTA events, all discussions will be limited to those subjects that are permitted by the antitrust laws. All members should refrain from any discussion or mention of competitively sensitive subjects such as the current or future prices charged for any member product or services, current or future marketing plans or strategies, and current or future costs, including employee salaries. There also must be no agreement on the suppliers or customers that members will do business with or the markets in which members will conduct business.

Violations of the antitrust laws can have serious consequences. If you have any questions or concerns about anything that is discussed at a ESTA meeting, please bring your concern to ESTA management. An easy to read pamphlet describing the antitrust laws is available from the ESTA staff.

Karl Ruling held up a copy of the pamphlet for all to see.

2.2 Reading of the call for patents

Tim Hansen read the following statement aloud to the assembly:

ESTA intends not to publish any standard that contains protected intellectual property, unless that information can be licensed by anyone for a reasonable fee. ESTA uses a process of open patent and copyright disclosures to implement its intent. ESTA does not conduct patent or copyright searches and does not warrant that its standards contain no protected intellectual property.

In keeping with the open disclosures policy, I ask if anyone present wishes to notify this working group of the existence of a patent, patent application, copyright, or other protected intellectual property that

might protect material in a standard being developed by this working group. You need not be the holder of the patent or copyright to notify this working group of its existence.

Nothing was revealed.

3.1 Requirements for membership

Tim Hansen read the following statement aloud to the assembly:

Membership is open to all parties who are affected by the work of the group; membership in ESTA is not a requirement, but there is a \$100/person/year participation fee to help fund running the Technical Standards Program. Voting members are required to attend meetings. Any principal member and alternate that both miss three consecutive meetings or that miss three consecutive letter ballots will have their membership status changed to observer; either class of inaction shall result in a loss of voting status. This action will be taken at the beginning of the first meeting after such inaction and will be recorded in the minutes of that meeting.

Richard Nix said that renewal emails had just gone out. Three people in the room said they had received theirs.

6.1 ANSI E1.26 - 2006 (R2017), shock absorption of floors

6.7 BSR E1.76, Wire rope tension grids

First draft progress update. How's it going?

Bruce Darden reported, In January he had provided everyone an early draft, and received comments only from Richard Nix. He then spent the next month rewriting, then sent it to Steve Walker for additional review and comment. There were a number of items that were brought back to light as a result of this review. He gave a few examples of issues that were discussed between Steve and him. He also added a section on use. He has submitted it to the working group, which is ready for a public review, he thinks. He moved to send it out to public review. The motion was seconded. There was discussion. Tim Hansen asked about the access requirements. Does this mean stairs or something else. Bruce said there are circumstances where wire grid panels are installed in a stepping layout, so does this mean they are a stair, or not? Bruce said he felt that it needed to be addressed, rather than ignored.

Tim then asked about 6.4.6.3, regarding hoisting beams. Is the hoist beam considered a tension grid accessory? Karl Ruling said that it is advice, but not part of the grid. Bruce agreed that this could be moved to an annex note. There was more discussion about the annex note content.

Steve Spendiff asked if stair risers should be open, or should they be closed. Bruce said that would be a mandatory requirement. It was not address, so Bruce revised 7.4 to indicate that the riser must have a toe board, and that the remaining height cannot exceed 4 inches, or must be covered with a mesh or solid panel so that objects cannot fall through.

Tim asked about 6.3.3.3, document retention. Bruce added words to indicate that the documentation is preserved by the manufacturer.

Tim then asked about 9.3, signage. What's on the sign? Bruce said he thought this was a circular reference back to 9.2 e or f. He suggested adding another section 9.4: *The sign shall state load capacities and limitations of use.*

Since there was clear discussion about the substantive changes requested, Bruce amended his motion to approve the revised draft. The motion was seconded, and carried without objection or abstention. The motion now forwards to the TSC.
