### 4.1 Reading of the anti-trust statement

The following statement was read aloud to the assembly by Bill Sapsis:

PLASA and its members take seriously their obligation to comply with all applicable antitrust laws. Therefore, during this meeting and during all PLASA events, all discussions will be limited to those subjects that are permitted by the antitrust laws. All members should refrain from any discussion or mention of competitively sensitive subjects such as the current or future prices charged for any member product or services, current or future marketing plans or strategies, and current or future costs, including employee salaries. There also must be no agreement on the suppliers or customers that members will do business with or the markets in which members will conduct business.

Violations of the antitrust laws can have serious consequences. If you have any questions or concerns about anything that is discussed at a PLASA meeting, please bring your concern to PLASA management. An easy to read pamphlet describing the antitrust laws is available from the PLASA staff.

Karl Ruling held up the pamphlet for the group. Nothing was reported.

### 4.2 Call for patents

The following statement was read aloud to the assembly by Bill Sapsis:

PLASA intends not to publish any standard that contains protected intellectual property, unless that information can be licensed by anyone for a reasonable fee. PLASA uses a process of open patent and copyright disclosures to implement its intent. PLASA does not conduct patent or copyright searches and does not warrant that its standards contain no protected intellectual property.

In keeping with the open disclosures policy, I ask if anyone present wishes to notify this working group of the existence of a patent or copyright or other intellectual property that might protect material in a standard being developed by this working group. You need not be the holder of the patent or copyright to notify this working group of its existence.

Nothing was reported regarding patents or other intellectual property.

The draft was in public review through 3 November 2014.

Dan Culhane reported that the group had a great meeting this morning (19 November). Comment resolutions had been drafted, and along with the revised draft standard, they will be distributed to the working group for consideration. They intend to have it ready by January, or March at the latest. Another public review will be required.

# 7.13 BSR E1.39 - 20xx, Entertainment Technology –Selection and Use of Personal Fall Arrest Systems on Portable Structures Used in the Entertainment Industry

The draft was in public review through 3 November 2014 with a concurrent letter ballot for acceptance as an ANS that went into recirculation through November 18.

Eddie Kramer moved to approve the drafted resolutions to Keith Burgess. The motion was seconded and approved by a show of hands, with one abstention.

The working group spent much time drafting resolutions to Ed Kish's comments.

Brad Dittmer then moved to approve the public review comment resolutions as drafted by the working group at this meeting. The motion was seconded and approved by a show of hands with one abstention.

Dan Culhane withdrew his letter ballot no vote on the grounds that his concerns are satisfied with the above resolutions.

Ted Paget then moved to approve the resolutions drafted in response to the comments and reasons offered on the working group letter ballot. The motion was seconded and approved by a unanimous show of hands.

No substantive changes were made to the draft standard. The motion to accept the document as an American National Standard, approved by letter ballot Rig/2014-2020r2, stood. The draft standard and the motion to accept it as an American National Standard shall be forwarded to the Technical Standards Council.

# 7.14 BSR E1.43 - 201x, Live performer flying effect standard

Shawn Nolan apologized for not having drafted any text about design factors and working load limits, but said that he will be doing so very soon. He will offer the text to Christine Kaiser for inclusion in the document.

Jerry Gorrell offered further comments and the working group made changes to the document per those comments. Having satisfied Jerry Gorrell's concerns, Charlie Wiener moved to offer the draft for public review. The motion was seconded and approved by a show of hands with one abstention.

# 7.19 BSR E1.56, Rigging Support Points Design, Fabrication, Installation, and Testing From the draft July minutes:

Bill Sapsis assigned Pete Happe, Carlos Ortega, Jonathan Deull, Chris Schmidt, Shawn Nolan, and Mike Wells to be on the task group.

Shawn Nolan announced that the task group is to meet twice during this meeting cycle, and that they have a skeleton document to work from already. Now that Tony J. Galuppi is a member of the working group, Shawn requested that he be added to the task group. Bill Sapsis approved.

## 8 Other business and announcements

### 8.1 Remembering Jay Glerum

Bill Sapsis reminded the group that PLASA is hosting a gathering to honor Jay Glerum on Friday, November 21st from 5pm - 6:30pm at the Westgate Las Vegas (formerly the Las Vegas Hotel) in Conference Room 2. He asked member to come and share their stories and memories of Jay.

### 8.2 The TSP Turns 20

Bill Sapsis reminded the group that this year marks 20 years of the TSP. He pointed the group to an article by Mike Garl, Karl Ruling, and Mike Wood, from the latest issue of Protocol, which can be read online at <a href="http://na.plasa.org/publications/protocol.html">http://na.plasa.org/publications/protocol.html</a>.

## 8.3 Technical marketing group

From the draft July minutes:

Bill Sapsis reported that PLASA is looking for a representative from the RWG to be on this committee to develop marketing campaigns to promote rigging standards. Chris Kaiser objected to the timing of the meeting. Bill Sapsis said that he will see about moving the meeting time. Scott Blair suggested Friday night.

Bill Sapsis reported that Jennifer O'Leary has offered to work with Lori Rubinstein on this.

### 8.4 Above & Beyond Awards

Bill Sapsis reminded the group that the nomination site is open year round at tsp.plasa.org/AboveandBeyond.

### 8.5 TSP sessions at LDI 2014

Bill Sapsis reminded the group that links to the full schedule of TSP-related 90-minute sessions, as well as the schedule for Standards on the Stage at PLASA booth 1469, are available at the TSP homepage, <a href="tsp.plasa.org">tsp.plasa.org</a>.

### 8.6 CEN standards update

Karl Ruling read from Ron Bonner's report from the first Plenary meeting of TC/433 at DIN, Berlin 13 August 2014:

This was the first plenary meeting of the newly formed TC/433 and DIN hosted the meeting at their offices in Berlin. Mr Michael Schmitt from DIN provided secretariat support and will be the TC/433 secretary.

There were 8 countries in attendance which included:

Austria

Belgium

Denmark

France

Germany

Netherlands

Spain

UK

The UK and Germany were the only members that provided a full delegation, and in some instances the representatives sent to the meeting were Standards bodies' representatives only and not industry subject matter experts.

Mr. Andreas Bickel from Germany was nominated as the chair by DIN without opposition and elected unanimously.

After the election of the chair, a drafting committee was created from volunteers from the committee.

Following the committee formalities Michael Schmitt gave a brief presentation of the CCMC (CEN/CENELEC Management Centre) and procedures for Standards creation.

There was agreement that for the purposes of nomenclature, TC433 will be titled TC433 *Entertainment Technology – Machinery: Equipment and installations.* 

The remainder of the meeting was given over to discussing the formulation of the New Work Items as part of the business plan to send to CEN with the intended work programme. Included within this discussion was a request for as many indications of the value of the business of entertainment technology/national value of entertainment.

The meeting agreed that the first order of work should be the adoption of CWA15902 parts 1 and 2 (Lifting and Load-bearing Equipment for Stages and other Production Areas within the Entertainment Industry - Part 1: General requirements (excluding aluminium and steel trusses and towers) and

Lifting and Load-bearing Equipment for Stages and other Production Areas within the Entertainment Industry - Part 2: Specifications for design, manufacture and for use of aluminium and steel trusses and towers)

A good deal of discussion prevailed regarding the content and documentation with Germany suggesting that the existing document (CWA) be laid against other standards and a new document be created. The UK was strongly against this as we felt that the CWA document was the document with a mandate to adopt as a standard and that the work, time and expense that the original drafting committee had committed to would be a waste of good work. The UK was asked to provide proof of the mandate from CEN to adopt the document (The vote taken at the end of CWA15902's first 3 year period) This can be provided in the CEN summary of the votes cast at this time.

Germany feels that the new Standard cannot contain Codes of Practices so there is a move to split the document to reflect this.

There are plans to form 2 working groups (WG) with WG 1 responsible for Machinery as per part one of the CWA and WG2. For Aluminium Trusses and Towers etc. Although there is no title assigned for this WG.

There was a suggestions that a further 2 working groups could be formed to look at *Definitions* and *Codes of Practice* 

There was also a great deal of discussion regarding the harmonisation of this document with the Machinery Directive and even after the Denmark representative pointed out that the requirements for harmonisation of EN standards has to come from the European Commission, Germany was insistent that a reference to the future consideration that this EN be a harmonised standard to comply with the Machinery Directive. As yet no indication has been given by Germany on what that conformity applies too as the machinery in question within CWA15902 is already required to meet the Low Voltage Directive, EMC and now the RoHS requirements along with the Machinery Directive.

A request for a convener of WG1 was made by the Chair and as The UK had already gone a good way to set this WG up under TC/10 the UK has again agreed to convene it. There is no other support other than editing services to a WG from BSI, so this WG cannot be confirmed until the logistics of the WG is agreed and support in place.

Other work items were briefly explained by Germany but these subjects were not discussed.

The meeting came to a close with commitment that the executive summary of the work will be sent to all delegations.

The date of the next meeting was set as the 19<sup>th</sup> of February 2015 and Spain has offered to host the next meeting in Madrid (subject to confirmation). The suggested meeting periods are initially every six months and then eventually every 12 months.

### **Action points**

- Confirm the formulation of the support functions to convene WG1
- Provide business proof of the value of national entertainment value

Bill Sapsis added that these efforts have no effect in North America; CEN standards have legal weight only in the European Union.

Mike Garl reported that E1.2 had been included in the part of CWA 15902 for aluminium truss, and that BSI was possibly going to be taking on a wire rope ladder standard. If they proceed, they will be using E1.1 as a starting point.

# 9 Schedule for future meetings

The group agreed to try to meet via teleconference on 30 January 2015 at noon EST. Details to be distributed when available.

# 10 Adjournment

Ted Paget moved the meeting adjourn. The motion was seconded. Hearing no objections or further discussion, Bill Sapsis declared the meeting adjourned at 22:27.
