1 Opening Remarks

2 Patent and anti-trust statements

2.1 Reading of the anti-trust statement

Bill Sapsis read the following statement aloud to the assembly:

ESTA and its members take seriously their obligation to comply with all applicable antitrust laws. Therefore, during this meeting and during all ESTA events, all discussions will be limited to those subjects that are permitted by the antitrust laws. All members should refrain from any discussion or mention of competitively sensitive subjects such as the current or future prices charged for any member product or services, current or future marketing plans or strategies, and current or future costs, including employee salaries. There also must be no agreement on the suppliers or customers that members will or will not do business with or the markets in which members will conduct business.

Violations of the antitrust laws can have serious consequences. If you have any questions or concerns about anything that is discussed at an ESTA meeting, please bring your concern to ESTA management. An easy to read pamphlet describing the antitrust laws is available from the ESTA staff.

Richard Nix held up the pamphlet.

2.2 Reading of the call for patents

Bill Sapsis read the following statement aloud to the assembly:

ESTA intends not to publish any standard that contains protected intellectual property, unless that information can be licensed by anyone for a reasonable fee. ESTA uses a process of open patent and copyright disclosures to implement its intent. ESTA does not conduct patent or copyright searches and does not warrant that its standards contain no protected intellectual property.

In keeping with the open disclosures policy, I ask if anyone present wishes to notify this working group of the existence of a patent, patent application, copyright, or other protected intellectual property that might protect material in a standard being developed by this working group. You need not be the holder of the patent or copyright to notify this working group of its existence.

3 Attendance and Membership

3.1 Requirements for membership

Bill Sapsis read the following statement aloud to the assembly:

Membership is open to all parties who are affected by the work of the group; membership in ESTA is not a requirement, but there is a \$100/person/year participation fee to help fund the costs of running the Technical Standards Program. New applications shall not be processed until the participation fee has been paid. Voting members are required to attend meetings and vote on letter ballots. Any principal member and alternate that both miss three consecutive meetings or that miss three consecutive letter ballots will have their membership status changed to observer. This action will be taken at the beginning of the first meeting after such inaction and will be recorded in the minutes of that meeting.

Richard Nix said that all of the TSP participation fee renewals had been sent, and asked everyone to pay them quickly if they have not already done so. Anyone not finding the original emails, or needing additional time to pay should contact him immediately to avoid being removed from the TSP. The pay-by deadline is today.

Richard Nix reported, there is no concern for the welding requirements because all of the companies who manufacture outside of the US do not use this standard, and have TUV-certified welders, providing a pathway to meeting this standard's requirements. Elmer Veith pointed out another potential issue with labeling and serialization.

Richard Nix noted the project is open for limited revision. John Ringelman cautioned about doing limited revisions, especially since we've just discussed other issues beyond welding. Richard agreed, saying he'll refile a new PINS, for a full revision.

Bill Sapsis appointed Elmer Veith (task group leader), Shawn Nolan, Scott England, Mike Weston, and Chris Schmidt to the task group.

The task group has submitted draft comment resolutions and an associated draft revision for working group consideration.

Eric Rouse reported. He moved to accept the proposed resolutions. The motion was seconded. There was discussion. Reid Neslage said he still had concerns about the requirement and resolution regarding his comment on equipment labeling. He read words from E1.6-2 – 2019 sec 3.1.1, saying he would prefer those nineteen words - stating a requirement for approval by a qualified person - instead of the wording that has been proposed, and it is fewer words. Robert Dean said that changing the words would make it more difficult to manage customer expectations. John Ringelman said that we should be careful to consider the ramifications of such a change, but

agreed the fewer words was better. Richard Nix noted that the standard already requires approval by the Flying System Designer who – by definition – is a qualified person.

The motion carried with 9 objections, and no abstentions.

Robert Dean moved to send to another public review. The motion was seconded and carried without objections or abstentions. A BSR8 will be filed, with public review commencing soon thereafter.

7.1 New project request: Rigging Access

Robert Peterson explained the need for the standard. Inspections are required, but often no cost-effective access is provided in order to accomplish the inspection. In many cases this means no inspection. The intent is for this to be referenced by the IBC. This would require the document to conform to the ICC style guide.

Tyler DeLong moved to approve the project. The motion was seconded. There was considerable discussion, both for and against the proposal. Main reasons against the proposal are that it could potentially create unreasonable cost increases to a construction project, and that it could place an unreasonable burden on the building designers and consultants – they have little or no control over project funding, but are often held accountable for cost overruns, and must also comply with any value-engineering measures requested by the owner. The motion failed to meet the required supermajority.

The project was proposed by Sanford P Gilzow, who was also present at the meeting. These minutes serve as the required written notification of the project request's disapproval.
